



America Divided Series, A House Divided

Norman Lear explores the housing divide in New York City, where he is confronted by one of the nation's starkest images of inequality: a record number of people experiencing homelessness living in the shadows of luxury skyscrapers filled with apartments purposely being kept empty. The creator of "All in the Family," "Good Times" and "The Jeffersons" speaks with tenants, realtors, those experiencing homelessness, housing activists, landlords, and city officials — investigating the Big Apple's affordability crisis, hedge fund speculation on residential housing, and a legacy of racist discrimination that still persists today.

Following the 45-minute film screening, there will be time for community conversation.

Rachel Wentworth, Executive Director of the <u>Housing Equality Center of Pennsylvania</u>

Rachel Wentworth has 23 years of experience in fair housing enforcement and education, including counseling and investigation, test coordination in the areas of rentals, sales, insurance, mortgage lending and accessibility, resolution of fair housing lawsuits and administrative complaints, conducting fair housing training for a variety of audiences, technical assistance on zoning and land use and fair housing compliance for local governments, and capacity building for other fair housing agencies. Prior to joining the Housing Equality Center, Rachel was a test coordinator at the Greater New Orleans Fair Housing Action Center. She holds a Master of Community and Regional Planning from Temple University.

- Healthy Start is a Community Health Worker model with tiered case management services for
 pregnant women. Staff focus on healthcare access to help ensure full-term and healthy
 pregnancies, support breastfeeding and infant care, manage information and resource
 coordination, connect moms with in-house counseling for Perinatal Mood and Anxiety Disorders
 or postpartum depressions, and civil legal assistance through our Medical Legal Partnership
 program.
- Nurse Family Partnership pairs first-time, low-income mothers with are home-visiting nurses throughout Delaware County. Women must be enrolled in the program prior to 28 weeks to be eligible for the program which continues until the baby's 2nd-birthday. This relationship-based program focuses on healthcare access and health education, positive parenting, infant growth and development, and support for mom in working towards self-sufficiency. Enrolled mothers are also able to access behavioral health supports and civil legal assistance.
- Delaware County WIC (Women, Infants and Children) Program is also a great program to
 ensure healthy pregnancies and improve birth outcomes, focusing on growth and development of
 children. It provides eligible pregnant, postpartum and breastfeeding women, infants and children
 under age 5 with nutrition information, breastfeeding support, and nutritious food and
 referrals. WIC helps to build strong, healthy families and ensure kids enter kindergarten healthy
 and ready to learn!
- Cribs for Kids is a referral-based program to provide Safe Sleep Education and a new Pack & Play to families who are challenged by extreme poverty and displacement due to domestic violence or house fires. Cribs for Kids nationally has been an important resource and champion in the fight to prevent sleep-related deaths in communities across America.

The Center for Hispanic Resources is a drop in (now telephonic) program that provides
assistance to Delaware County's Spanish-speaking community. Bilingual case management staff
assist participants with completing applications, making appointments and connecting with
community-based resources, providing translation services and limited interpretation services.

Healthy Start, Nurse-Family Partnership &
Cribs for Kids staff
are here for you during the COVID-19 Crisis.

If you are pregnant and live in Delaware County, please contact us to learn about our helpful programs including; telehealth nurse and case management support, social work services, safe sleep education and supplies, breastfeeding support and civil legal assistance.
