Thanks to funding from the Delaware County Department of Human Services, Division of Drugs and Alcohol, this Summit will be offered to everyone as a free, virtual event.










Suicide Risk

Delaware County and Pennsylvania - 2021 Overall rates (combined 6th, 8th, 10th, and 12th Grade)



What is 'typical' behavior of a Delaware County Youth Age 11-18?

- Does not drink alcohol
- 87% report no Past 30-Day Use of Alcohol Slightly higher than the State average (86.6 %)
- Does not smoke Cigarettes
 98.8% report no Past 30-Day Use of Cigarettes
 Higher than the State average (97.7%)
- Does not smoke Marijuana
- 92.3% report no Past 30–Day Use of Marijuana Slightly lower than the State average (93%)
- Does not Vape
- 88.2% report no Past 30–Day Use of Vape products Higher than the state average (87%)
- Has never been suspended from school
- 92.6% report no suspensions Lower than the state average (94.8%)

Feature: Racial Justice in Recreation

The following is an excerpt from an article on KABOOM's website:

"A prominent social reformer and civil rights activist at the turn of the 20th century, Lugenia Burns Hope challenged Jim Crow segregation in Atlanta at a time when no public parks or recreational spaces existed for Black children in the entire city – or in practically any city in America. Soon after moving to Atlanta in 1898, Lugenia joined a group of neighborhood women who organized to establish free kindergartens for the children of working mothers, and to raise funds to purchase land and equipment for community playspaces.

These early projects served as a springboard for other efforts to improve the quality of life for Black families in Atlanta. Lugenia worked with a group that evolved into the Neighborhood Union, the first female-run service agency for African-Americans in the city. The Union provided much-needed services that the government failed to provide to Black residents, including medical care, employment opportunities, recreation, and education."







Healthy Start is a Community Health Worker model with tiered case management services for
pregnant women. Staff focus on healthcare access to help ensure full-term and healthy
pregnancies, support breastfeeding and infant care, manage information and resource
coordination, connect moms with in-house counseling for Perinatal Mood and Anxiety Disorders

or postpartum depressions, and civil legal assistance through our Medical Legal Partnership program.

- Nurse Family Partnership pairs first-time, low-income mothers with are home visiting nurses throughout Delaware County. Women must be enrolled in the program prior to 28 weeks to be eligible for the program which continues until the baby's 2nd birthday. This relationship-based program focuses on healthcare access and health education, positive parenting, infant growth and development, and support for mom in working towards self-sufficiency. Enrolled mothers are also able to access behavioral health supports and civil legal assistance.
- Delaware County WIC (Women, Infants and Children) Program is also a great program to
 ensure healthy pregnancies and improve birth outcomes, focusing on growth and development of
 children. It provides eligible pregnant, postpartum and breastfeeding women, infants and children
 under age 5 with nutrition information, breastfeeding support, and nutritious food and
 referrals. WIC helps to build strong, healthy families and ensure kids enter kindergarten healthy
 and ready to learn!
- Cribs for Kids is a referral-based program to provide Safe Sleep Education and a new Pack &
 Play to families who are challenged by extreme poverty and displacement due to domestic
 violence or house fires. Cribs for Kids nationally has been an important resource and champion in
 the fight to prevent sleep-related deaths in communities across America.
- The Center for Hispanic Resources is a drop in (now telephonic) program that provides assistance to Delaware County's Spanish-speaking community. Bilingual case management staff assist participants with completing applications, making appointments and connecting with community-based resources, providing translation services and limited interpretation services.
