



Quick History - Gordon Parks Photographer & Civil Rights Activist

"One of the greatest photographers of the 20th century, Parks was a humanitarian with a deep commitment to social justice. He left behind an exceptional body of work that documents American life and culture from the early 1940s into the 2000s, with a focus on race relations, poverty, civil rights, and urban life."

Although the images of bunks, kids swimming, eating and playing may be described as mundane, 'Parks' camp images are sharp and subversive, stark statements from a man who later described his camera as "a weapon against poverty, against racism, against all sorts of social wrongs." By presenting an idyllic vision of America as he hoped it could be, but knew it wasn't, Parks created photos that resisted the country's segregation, in nature and beyond.

Parks had gone to the summer camps on assignment for the Office of Wartime Information to document scenes of everyday life. But Black children enjoying integrated natural spaces was not actually a part of everyday life at the time. By the 1940s, American culture had been systematically excluding people of color from outdoor recreational spaces, both physically and ideologically, for decades. As the U.S. urbanized at the end of the 19th century, many white people regarded (and cordoned off) wild and natural spaces as places for white people to go for a reprieve from metropolitan life. Summer camps, in particular, emerged as segregated spaces for white boys to cultivate masculinity through outdoor recreation.

But a small number of organizations used what historian Marcia Chatelain calls "camping activism" to counteract this ideology, including administrators at the New York camps Parks visited. Typically run by local charities or churches, these Northeastern organizations offered outdoor activities for children of color during the first half of the 20th century (though they never came close to offering the same number of camping activities available to white children nationwide). These progressive camp leaders believed that refashioning summer camps into microcosms of integration would advance equity in the outdoors—and elsewhere.



- Healthy Start is a Community Health Worker model with tiered case
 management services for pregnant women. Staff focus on healthcare access
 to help ensure full-term and healthy pregnancies, support breastfeeding and
 infant care, manage information and resource coordination, connect moms
 with in-house counseling for Perinatal Mood and Anxiety Disorders or
 postpartum depressions, and civil legal assistance through our Medical Legal
 Partnership program.
- Nurse Family Partnership pairs first-time, low-income mothers with are home visiting nurses throughout Delaware County. Women must be enrolled in the program prior to 28 weeks to be eligible for the program which continues until the baby's 2nd birthday. This relationship-based program focuses on healthcare access and health education, positive parenting, infant growth and development, and support for mom in working towards self-sufficiency. Enrolled mothers are also able to access behavioral health supports and civil legal assistance.
- Delaware County WIC (Women, Infants and Children) Program is also a
 great program to ensure healthy pregnancies and improve birth outcomes,
 focusing on growth and development of children. It provides eligible pregnant,
 postpartum and breastfeeding women, infants and children under age 5 with
 nutrition information, breastfeeding support, and nutritious food and
 referrals. WIC helps to build strong, healthy families and ensure kids enter
 kindergarten healthy and ready to learn!
- Cribs for Kids is a referral-based program to provide Safe Sleep Education and a new Pack & Play to families who are challenged by extreme poverty and displacement due to domestic violence or house fires. Cribs for Kids nationally has been an important resource and champion in the fight to prevent sleeprelated deaths in communities across America.
- The Center for Hispanic Resources is a drop in (now telephonic) program
 that provides assistance to Delaware County's Spanish-speaking
 community. Bilingual case management staff assist participants with
 completing applications, making appointments and connecting with
 community-based resources, providing translation services and limited
 interpretation services.

The Foundation for Delaware County's Healthy Start, Nurse-Family Partnership & Cribs for Kids staff are here for you during the COVID-19 Crisis.

If you are pregnant and live in Delaware County, please contact us to learn about our helpful programs including; telehealth nurse and case management support, social work services, safe sleep education and supplies, breastfeeding support and civil legal assistance. Please share with others who may qualify!
