# **POWERFUL FACTS**

- Since 1990, the number of women inmates has grown at an average annual rate of 8.5%
- More than 2.8 million women were under correctional care and 80% are mothers. 2.3 million are mothers
- There are 2.7 million children with a parent in prison or jail
- 92% of parents in prison are fathers
- On any given day, there are more than 500,000 fathers in prison
- Approximately 2.7 million children have an incarcerated parent, from 500,000 children in 1991
- On any give day 7.3 million children have a parent in prison or under state or federal supervision
- There are 10.7 million children affected by incarceration when including the number of parents in local jails, and probation and parole
